ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE INCREASING THE RATES CHARGED BY THE CITY OF CHERRY VALLEY, ARKANSAS, FOR THE USE OF ITS WATER AND SEWER SYSTEMS.

WHEREAS, The City of Cherry Valley, Arkansas, (City) owns and operates water and sewage facilities and has determined that to continue to offer these services to the inhabitants of the City, it will be necessary to increase the sewage and water rates; and

WHEREAS, The City has been authorized by general election to issue general obligation bonds for the improvement of the sewage and water system, and to effectuate this improvement, the increased rates are necessary; and

WHEREAS, The rates now charged by the City for use of the sewer and water system are the rates established in 1963, and the cost of offering the services rendered to the inhabitants of the City has increased considerably.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Cherry Valley, Arkansas:

Section 1. That the water rates for the use by the inhabitants of the Cherry Valley water and sewage system be as follows:

First 2,000 gallons	\$4.50 minimum
Next 3,000 gallons	1.70 per 1,000 gallons
Next 5,000 gallons	1.15 per 1,000 gallons
	.95 per 1,000 gallons
Next 10,000 gallons	.95 per 1,000 gallons
All over 20,000 gallons	.80 per 1,000 gallons

Section 2. The City hereby establishes the following rates for use of the sewer system: A flat rate of \$3.00 per month, plus thirty per cent (30%) of the monthly water bill.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately after its passage.
