

ORDINANCE 60B

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING TO BE A NUISANCE THE ENTERING UPON OF PRIVATE RESIDENCES FOR THE PURPOSE OF SOLICITING THE SALE OF GOODS, WARES, MERCHANDISE OR SERVICES WITHOUT THE INVITATION OF THE OWNER OR OCCUPANTS THEREOF, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHERRY VALLEY, ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. That practice of entering in and upon the premises of private residences in the city of Cherry Valley, Arkansas, by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers and itinerant vendors for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares, merchandise or services, and/or for the purpose of disposing of and/or peddling or hawking the same, without first having been requested or advised so to do by the owner or occupant of the premises, is hereby declared to be a nuisance and punishable as such nuisance as a misdemeanor.

SECTION 2. Any person convicted of perpetrating a nuisance as described and prohibited in the first Section of this ordinance, shall be fined in the sum of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00), nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), together with the costs of the proceedings.

SECTION 3. Whereas, the ringing of door bells and the uninvited solicitation of the sale of commodities by peddlers and itinerant vendors, have become highly annoying and disturbing to the occupants of residential property, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
